FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR B

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY Dianne Bergant CSA

This Sunday is traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday. Two major themes emerge from the readings: an image of the one who saves; and the power of salvation itself. The one who saves is not a mighty warrior who comes in military array. In fact, he is the one who was rejected, who was hunted down, humiliated, tortured and hung naked on a tree, there to die in shame. The one who saves is the cornerstone of the building, holding it together, forming a firm foundation so that the structure will not collapse. The one who saves is a lowly shepherd, entrusted with sheep, not with the affairs of state. The one who saves is an unlikely saviour. This characterisation should give us pause. Is it possible that we have been looking for a saviour in the wrong places?

God's saving power flows from steadfast covenant love. It broke open the world in the death and resurrection of Jesus and it overflows as healing grace. The saving power in the name of Jesus, a name that itself means 'saviour' (cf. Matt 1:21), is for all people, even for those sheep who do not yet belong to this fold. Furthermore, it is for all time; God's mercy endures forever. Through our baptism we can bring the saving grace of God to a world in desperate need of healing. We can do this in our families, in our local communities, in the workplace, in so many situations of our lives.

ADSUMUS Initiative for Parishes — Launch Date: 20-21 April 2024

The Parish Renewal Office of the Archdiocese under the guidance of Bishop Don Sproxton has started organising a trial run of the new ADSU-MUS initiative for parishes. This initiative hopes to revitalise, renew and develop our parishes so that they can operate more effectively as the communities our God needs them to be in today's world.

ADSUMUS is taken from the prayer recited before every session of the Second Vatican Council held from 1962-1965. The opening line of the prayer 'Adsumus Sancte Spiritus', put simply, means "Here We Are O Holy Spirit."

This initiative will assist each of us in coming to a truer understanding of our role and identity as parishioners so that we may discern the unique contribution each of us can make to the life of the parish. The hope is that by working together - sharing our gifts and talents - we will become a stronger faith community.

Our parish of St Benedict's has been chosen as one of four parishes to trial this initiative. As we launch ADSUMUS on the weekend of the 21s April, we ask the Holy Spirit that this journey we begin soon will bind us all in a stronger, loving community.


Conversation



This is the only name by which we can be saved.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. A reading from the first letter of St John

We shall see God as he is.

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are.

Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us.

My dear people, we are already the children of God

but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed:

all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him

because we shall see him as he really is.

Gospel John 10:11-18

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *The good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep.* Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd:

the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold,

and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd.
The Father loves me, because I lay down my life

because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free

I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
